# RUGBY FOOTBALL

## Hayle's good display against the Reds

The popular Redruth side paid their visit to Hayle on February the 6th and although they came out winners by 24 pts. to 9, it was a hard game, and except during a portion of the second half, when the home players slackened a little, and the Reds scored most of their points, the home play was irreproachable.

The first half was certainly in the homesters favour, when the Reds had to be very alert to keep their line intact.

Finish was lacking with the play of the home team otherwise the Reds line would have been crossed on at least two occasions

The form of the Redruth players was not very impressive up to half-time, and the visiting Captain found it advisable to rearrange his team for the second half. Jennings who had been playing at full-back, was now brought up to the centre three-quarter, and there is no doubt that this player made all the difference to the outside play of the visitors, and enabled them to score so many points.

This game will be long remembered for some very fine goal kicking. H. Bond kicking two very fine goals for the home team, and R. Ellis's goal was also a very fine kick. Jennings was also in fine kicking form for the Reds, scoring with some very fine shots.

Taking into consideration that the Reds brought down a very strong side, and that three alterations had to be made in the home team, the result of this game was very satisfactory.

If the home team can maintain this form they need not fear any of the other Cornish sides. The greatest disappointment in connection with this match was the gate receipts, being very small for such an important fixture. It is no secret, if Rugby Football is to keep going in Hayle more support is needed. It is up to the town of Hayle to see that the Hayle Club must not close its books for the want of finance. It should be remembered that the Hayle Club is the oldest Club in the County, and will always be remembered for turning out many fine players.

I can assure your readers, that the Hayle Club would greatly appreciate donations no matter how small to enable them to keep the good old flag flying at Hayle.

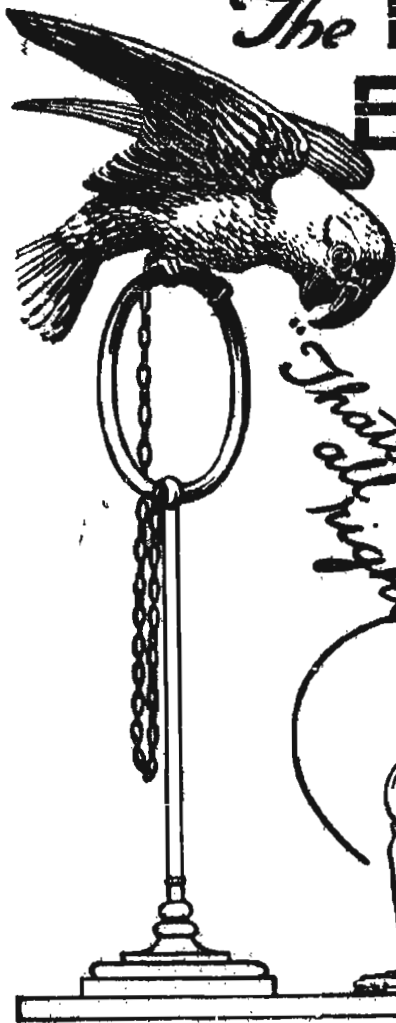

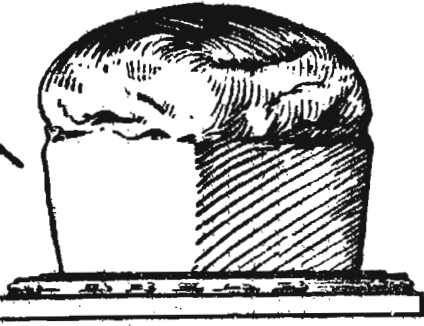

## HAIL! Hayle's Male Men!

It is clear that those who make the greatest show do not always do the most work.

Seldom do we find the Port of Hayle flurried with excitement over work done or to be done. Rather, in a true British way, the men plod away and in the course of a year do an amazing amount of work.

A review of the past year yields vrey creditable accounts and quite astounding figures. Of course, it is unavoidable that the imports very largely exceed the exports. However, a few approximate figures will give a good idea as to how much merchandise is handled in a year.

During the year 1931 approximately 35,000 tons of coal, 11,000 tons of grain and 1,400 tons of cement were imported. In addition to this 5,000 tons of stone from Newlyn, four cargoes of explosives, one cargo of timber and the weekly visit of a General Cargo Ship were dealt with in the Port.

The exports comprised mostly of Sugarbeet, about 1,000 tons of this commodity being dispatched during the season.

The Port is also visited periodically by Oil Boats which discharge large and valuable cargoes.

Altogether there is a tremendous amount of labour expended in the Port during the course of a year and it is to the credit of all concerned that it is expended so well.
